“From April 2008 thru March 2009 the most frequently cited OSHA violation was for the failure to protect employees within the trench by sloping or shoring of the trench; 144 violations of this requirement led to penalties of \$1,201,825 and 68 violations for the competent person either failing to conduct inspections of the trench or to remove employees from the hazards of the trench. Failing to provide a means of egress, such as a ladder, from the trench resulted in penalties of \$159,425. Each violation of this standard resulted in an average penalty of over \$8,000. This is far more than the costs to properly protect employees who will work in the trench. “
